OB1) lights on poles, outside bathrooms. These were winterized by a local plumber, voucher included in the General Warrant this month. The lights on the poles will wait until spring.

OB2) information regarding speed limit signs in the hamlet: **quote from ElanCity, Long Island City NY for \$7,860.** For 3 flashing radar speed limit signs, 80w solar panels, batteries, traffic data, Bluetooth and delivery. Supervisor Heisler will continue to talk with the company for more information and with the Town Insurance Co to see if the signs would be covered; if not, can coverage be added? Also checking with NYSDOT and the County to see if there is a problem with these signs being placed in the road right-of-way.

OB4) fees associated with the Cable franchise. Most TB members were not in favor of charging extra fees as a surcharge.

OB5) change of street lighting fixtures to LED bulbs. Cammarata said the complete fixture of each street light has to be changed over. The Town can either purchase them, make the change and maintain the lights or wait for LED lights to be available from NYSEG.

OB6: status of the Communications Tower

• At the meeting, it was recommended to have to have the FCC license before proceeding. Hwy Sup't Oliver said the license came through today, but that there were still some issues to work out with regard to the cost of the proposal. The Village of Greene will still set the pole on location on the right-of-way on County Rd. 2 on Joe Warren's land. NYSEG has a charge of \$400 + for supplying electricity to the line because it is a non-residential situation. There are 2 quotes for wiring and inspections, one from Rich Barnes for \$1500. And another coming from Rick Lavin for about \$1000. There is still the final quote from Tri-County Communications to be determined.

OB7: Public Parking: This issue was also addressed in the PB report. There are no current options for parking. It was suggested to keep eyes open for possibilities or perhaps develop another area. Supervisor Heisler will talk with Seeber's Tavern owner Chris Fiene.

 Communications Tower and/or tarps for Town trucks (\$12,500) and the remainder (\$12,500) into the
 Town of Smithville account for large unexpected expenses. This was brought to Resolution.

RESOLUTION # 43 (2016): AUTHORIZE TRANSFER OF MONIES
