This concern has already been sent to Chenango County; the house has asbestos and it needs to be tested for the amount. The Town cannot take responsibility for the building and cannot burn it, but it could be buried. It is still a County concern. Katha Root also complained about the property further toward the 4 corners where a trailer is being dismantled. The county is aware of that situation as well.

Fire Chief Ken Whitmore: A GoFundMe was set up for the owners of the 933 County Rd. 3 property but there is no way to track it as far as who really contributed and where the funds were spent. No further action was taken.

NB4) Consider Action on Animal Control Officer position vs. Dog Warden position for Smithville Town Clerk Owens indicated in a discussion with Matt Caldwell, Chenango County Personnel, that the Town could ask a Dog Warden to take on some additional responsibilities such as attend Court if a summons was issued for a dog complaint or try to locate an owner before taking the dog to an SPCA. After additional discussion it was decided to keep the position as Dog Warden as opposed to Animal Control Officer and to advertise the position for applications.

(see # 6 on Town Clerk's report) When Frontier installed fiber-optic service to the Community Center in March 2021, the fire alarm was thrown offline as it required 2 dedicated phone lines for operation or a purchased cell booster could be used. After consideration, the Board decided to purchase the Star-Link cell booster, pending successful testing of the system, from Maximum Security who initially installed the fire alarms.

NB9) Councilman Whitmore asked who is going to remove the snow on sidewalks in front of Dollar General and new State Hwy 41 bridge? After discussion, Planning Board Chair Butler said a Local Law should be considered to require maintenance by owners for sidewalks in the Community. It was suggested to move this to the Planning Board and/or the Town Att'y for suggestions. A cross-over walkway to Dollar General was also suggested. This would have to go through the NYSDOT. Supervisor Cammarata will contact them and Att'y Berger.

Councilman Evans left at 7:45pm

NB10) Councilman Whitmore also expressed his concern about the disrepair of the dam at the former Hansmann's Mill site on the Genegantslet and the potential problems it could cause. He felt the DEC should consider removing the dam and cleaning out both the Genegantslet Creek and Pond creek. Both creeks have a lot of debris in them which causes and has caused continuous water problems in the hamlet. Supervisor Cammarata will contact the DEC to discuss the situation.

NB11) Councilman Whitmore also asked when the County was sponsoring Halloween? Has a specific day been declared other than Sunday? Should the Town have their own? The answer was unknown but other communities are still celebrating on October 31st.

OB1) updates on Local Law # 4 2021: Opt Out of Cannabis. The Town had passed the Resolution opting out of Cannabis, has advertised for and has held a public hearing but it was discovered the Town was supposed to have the Public Hearing 1st then wait 45 days for complaints. IF no complaints or petitions come in then the Resolution would be declared in effect on November 8th.

OB2) updates on electronic sign board: This summer's hot weather caused a component on the circuit board to short out. It did start up again on its own and can be used.

OB3) updates on buildings and grounds cameras: Tim Hanna, working with the Town on computer/software related items has been able to re-connect the cameras, software and substitute laptop to get everything working again. A cable and sd card were purchased to help update the system but a new small form computer will be needed as the older one is no longer good. The computer will need to be stronger than the old laptop currently powering the system. Tim will make recommendations shortly. Town Clerk Owens asked to have to

older laptops and 2 small form computers declared excess property as they are old, not updated or not working.

OB4) considerations of Town land use in hamlet:

• The land developer for a proposed Senior Center 55+ is working on the arrangements with a letter of intent to be mailed to Supervisor Cammarata in the next couple of weeks. It is not known if a 1 story or 2 story building will be proposed. Fire Chief Ken Whitmore asked about plans for fire protection. Fires are easier controlled with single story than with a 2 story.

Planning Board Chair Butler: the project should be put out to bid.

If the Town's intent is to sell the property for a 55+ property development, then the Town Board would need to declare the property surplus 1st, then it would need to be approved by Public Referendum.

OB5) updates on repeater on County Rd. 3

- the antenna has to be upgraded as it was a low budget item that was installed; the repeater is hooked up. Can the Town get a credit on the old repeater/antenna?
- grant monies from ARP are available but there is difficulty in finding what the \$ can be used for

Ken Whitmore: suggested connecting with the Greene school district, Town and Village of Greene which goes through a County repeater and link in with them. There may be a cost for this. This was suggested a few years ago but action on it was never completed.

Currently there is no communication between the Town highway trucks right now due to the loss of this repeater.

Councilman Whitmore: could upgrade equipment and then work with Greene which would help.

OB6) updates on JRC

Greene Town Supervisor Joe Henning asked the Town of Smithville for its JRC payment for 2021. Supervisor Cammarata asked if there was going to be a credit for the \$1100. overpayment created by Chenango County. The JRC has been given more than what was needed. A FOIL request answered by the JRC did not have all of the information which was in the request.

Councilman Whitmore: the JRC needs to be paid—it's for the kids.

Councilwoman Holcomb: recommended the Town remove the \$1100. Chenango County paid and pay the remaining \$3,000 for 2021 to the JRC, with revision in the signed contract.
